POLICE RECRUITMENT 2023 | Aadhaar fraud used to hijack exam

Gwalior-Chambal region emerges as epicentre

The Gwalior-Morena district had emerged as the epicentre of the police recruitment scam-2023, which was carried out through Aadhaar manipulation, said officials here on Thursday.

Recently, the police busted a racket of manipulating the Aadhaar card of candidates who appeared in the exam, so that they cleared the test with the help of solvers.

While the FIRs registered so far and the ongoing investigations have led the police to over 20 candidates who were selected through this fraud, it would not be surprising if the numbers zoom to 50-100 as the investigations gather pace and more FIRs are registered in the coming days.

“A clutch of solvers has also been identified. Some of them hail from Morena and Sheopur districts of Gwalior-Chambal region of MP,

besides some others from Bihar who have already been arrested,” a senior police officer said.

Sources privy to the ongoing investigations in different districts of the state told the Free Press that the photos and biometrics (fingerprints) were manipulated with the help of select Aadhaar card centres in Gwalior and Morena districts, including one in Bhitwar (Gwalior).

“While the epicentre of the entire fraud is Morena district, suspects in adjoining Gwalior, Shivpuri, Sheopur and Bhind districts of the same Gwalior-Chambal region too played key roles,” a

police officer said.

“The Aadhaar card of each of the beneficiary candidates was updated/modified twice, first just before the written test in July-August 2023 and later just before the PPT in October-December 2024. While the unique Aadhaar number remained unchanged, the pictures and fingerprints (of the Aadhaar card-holder, who was the actual candidate) were replaced with those of the solver. With the modified Aadhaar card, the solver appeared in the written test in place of the actual candidate in 2023,” sources connected with the ongoing probe said.

“Those running the rackets charged Rs 10-15 lakh from individual candidates (actual beneficiaries), out of which Rs 4-5 lakh was given to the solvers,” a police officer said.

ADG selection and recruitment, Sonali Mishra said, “Most of the people connected with the crime are from the northern part of the state, like Bhind, Morena and Gwalior. The cases are registered in different parts of the state, but the people are connected to these districts”. She said that one solver had appeared for multiple candidates, because the exam was held on different dates. In coming days, more cases would be registered in the matter, she said.

Accused sent to police remand for two days

The accused arrested in connection with the murder of choreographer Amit Pal, a resident of Silver Oaks Colony, were produced before the court on Thursday and sent to police remand till June 7.

According to DSP (Head-

quarters Rural) Umakant Choudhary, Amit was missing from home since the night of June 1 and his body was recovered from a pit in the jungle of Simrol on June 3. He was reportedly strangled to death by the accused and later his body was dumped in the pit filled with water.

In this case, his cousin

Jayesh Pal, his friend Ganesh and a minor boy were caught by the police. Jayesh allegedly confessed his crime and informed the police that he killed Amit with the help of his friends after calling him in the jungle. Amit was celebrating his brother's birthday when the accused had called him to the jungle on the pretext of a party and later

killed him.

Amit was in contact with a girl and Jayesh was a one-sided lover of that girl. After seeing the girl with Amit, Jayesh had allegedly prepared a plan to kill him with the help of Ganesh. Jayesh and Ganesh were produced before the court from where they were sent to jail. The police are yet to recover their mobile phones and evidence pertaining to the case.

Free health camp serves 1167 patients

The first in a series of 61 divisional-level free preventive health camps was launched on Thursday by Shri Aurobindo Hospital in collaboration with the public health and medical education department.

Held at Sanmati School in the Residency area, the camp provided free health check-ups to 1,167 people, covering heart, liver, cancer, TB, bone,

dental and eye ailments. Advanced tests like ECG, X-ray, sonography, mammography and biopsies were conducted. Commissioner Deepak Singh emphasised treatment follow-ups for government employees. Dr Vinod Bhandari highlighted the role of “Umeed” buses in cancer screening. More camps are scheduled at schools, clinics and public health centres across the city in the coming weeks, ensuring broader community health outreach.

From Bhopal's Goat Market to Mumbai: 'Kohinoor' & 'King of the World'

With the festival of Eid-ul-Azha around the corner, Bhopal's goat markets are abuzz. Traders are claiming that with fewer goats on sale this year, the prices are also high. Stealing the limelight this year were two hefty animals with equally unique names, 'King of the World' and 'Kohinoor', which were sold for Rs 18 lakh and Rs 16 lakh, respectively.

Both of them, reared by the Nadeem Goat Farm, were purchased by a Mumbai busi-

nessman a couple of days ago. Nadeem Bhai, the operator of the farm, said he

spent quite a bit on rearing the two. He said there were separate arrangements for

these two, from food to living conditions to exercise. Their diet included cashews and almonds for breakfast, along with vegetables and salad. The two goats were kept in an air-cooled atmosphere as they couldn't stand the heat. They also had regular medical checkups to ensure their health, he added. It is not a surprise, then, that 'King of the World' weighs 174 kgs while 'Kohinoor' is 161 kgs. The two got so popular here that their videos and photos were widely shared on social media. Another medium-sized

white, furry goat is also catching attention due to its beauty. The goat's owner claimed to have brought it from Kashmir for Rs 1 lakh. People are flocking to goat markets in Jahangirabad, Gandhi Nagar, Vidisha Road, and other places as the festival nears. Goat trader Zahid said the cost of goats is higher this year. A single, regular-sized goat is sold for Rs 10,000 to Rs 15,000. However, the heavier ones are being sold for upwards of Rs25,000, depending on their beauty and other qualities.
